Nature of support 2014/15
<p>Teaching Assistant Support We employ skilled teaching assistants at Barnston and we deploy them carefully to support children's learning. This may be in the form of one to one work or group work in the classroom or out of the classroom. Sometimes our teaching assistants work within the classroom allowing the class teacher to concentrate on a specific group of children. When children work outside the classroom on focused tasks, the class teacher is able to concentrate his or her teaching on a smaller number of children, addressing more specific needs.</p> <p>Specific Tailored Programmes Sometimes specific programmes, usually short term, are established; where it is felt a child has a specific need which must be addressed in order for them to progress with their learning. This may be provided by a qualified teacher or a teaching assistant with specific skills.</p> <p>Educational Visits/Visitors in School In addition, support may be given to allow children to access valuable learning experiences at Barnston. For example subsidising educational visits and residentials or visitors into school.</p> <p>Additional teacher materials bought Materials to enhance Literacy in Y1-6 to enable them to improve in Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling.</p>

Sports Apprentice

Used to enhance the skills of Pupil Premium children and to increase confidence in this subject and skills applied.

Mymaths and Alfie maths costs

Used for all Pupil Premium children to enhance their maths skills.

Measuring the impact of PPG spending**Ensuring Impact at Barnston**

The progress of all our children, including our pupil premium children is monitored regularly by the Headteacher, subject leaders and class teachers. Formal monitoring happens once a term and necessary actions are agreed to prevent any child falling behind and to ensure more able children remain challenged. Intervention programmes and whole school strategies are evaluated closely and impact measured. This information is used to decide future actions.

Impact of 2014/15 PPG

All the children within Pupil Premium made good to outstanding progress in reading, writing and mathematics. The school gaps analysis 2014 for Y6 demonstrates that there are no gaps in the impact of teaching and learning on Pupil Premium or Non Pupil Premium children. (see overall KS2 results on the website). Analysis throughout the school demonstrates better than expected progress from the vast majority of Pupil Premium children in KS 2 with no gaps and in KS1 the gap is decreasing.

All the children are happy, well behaved, emotionally stable and continue to receive the best of care and attention from all staff.
